ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE
PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION
PURSUANT TO RULE 4:52,
WITH TEMPORARY RESTRAINTS

THIS MATTER having been brought before the Court by Frank L. Corrado, Esquire, attorney for plaintiff South Jersey Against AIDS, Inc. d/b/a South Jersey Aids Alliance, and individual plaintiffs D.G., R.K. and F.J., seeking relief by way of preliminary injunction at the return date set forth below pursuant to \underline{R} . 4:52, based upon the facts set forth in the Verified Complaint and for good cause shown,

IT IS on this 29^{th} day of **SEPTEMBER**, 2021, ORDERED that defendant City of Atlantic City appear and show cause before **JUDGE**

MICHAEL J. BLEE at the Atlantic County Courthouse in Atlantic City, New Jersey at 9:30 a.m., or as soon thereafter as counsel can be heard, on the 12th day of NOVEMBER, 2021, why an order should not be issued preliminarily enjoining and restraining the City of Atlantic City, during the pendency of this litigation, from enforcing Ordinance No. 32 of 2021, or taking any action to hinder or obstruct the operation of plaintiff's syringe access program at 32 Tennessee Avenue, Atlantic City, New Jersey or at any other location in Atlantic City;

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, pending the return date of this order, Defendant Atlantic City is temporarily restrained from enforcing Ordinance No. 32 of 2021, or taking any action to hinder or obstruct the operation of plaintiff's syringe access program at 32 Tennessee Avenue, Atlantic City, New Jersey or at any other location in Atlantic City; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

1. A copy of this order to show cause, verified complaint, legal memorandum and any supporting affidavits or certifications submitted in support of this application be served upon the defendant within **THREE** (3) **DAYS** of the date hereof, in accordance with R. 4:4-3 and R. 4:4-4, this being original process.

- 2. The plaintiffs must file with the court their proof of service of the pleadings on the defendant no later than **THREE** (3) **DAYS** before the return date.
- 3. Defendant shall file and serve a written response to this order to show cause and the request for entry of injunctive relief and proof of service by OCTOBER 21, 2021. The original documents must be filed with the clerk of the Superior Court in Atlantic County listed above. You must send a copy of your opposition papers directly to JUDGE BLEE. You must also send a copy of your opposition papers to the plaintiff's attorney whose name and address appears above. A telephone call will not protect your rights; you must file your opposition and pay the required fee of \$175.00 and serve your opposition on your adversary, if you want the court to hear your opposition to the injunctive relief the plaintiff is seeking.
- 4. The plaintiffs must file and serve any written reply to the defendant's order to show cause opposition by NOVEMBER 1, 2021. The reply papers must be filed with the Clerk of the Superior Court in Atlantic County and a copy of the reply papers must be sent directly to the chambers of JUDGE BLEE.
- 5. If the defendant does not file and serve opposition to this order to show cause, the application will be decided on the papers on the return date and relief may be granted by default,

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provided that the plaintiff files a proof of service and a proposed form of order at least three days prior to the return date.

- 6. If the plaintiff has not already done so, a proposed form of order addressing the relief sought on the return date (along with a self-addressed return envelope with return address and postage) must be submitted to the court no later than three (3) days before the return date.
- 7. Defendant, take notice that the plaintiffs have filed a lawsuit against you in the Superior Court of New Jersey. The verified complaint attached to this order to show cause states the basis of the lawsuit. If you dispute this complaint, you, or your attorney, must file a written answer to the complaint and proof of service within 35 days from the day of service of this order to show cause; not counting the day you received it.

These documents must be fled with the Clerk of the Superior Court in Atlantic County. Include a \$175.00 filing fee payable to the "Treasurer State of New Jersey." You must also send a copy of your Answer to the plaintiffs' attorney whose name and address appear above. Please note: Opposition to the order to show cause is not an Answer and you must file both. Please note further: if you do not file and serve an Answer within 35 days of this Order, the Court may enter a default against you for the relief plaintiff demands.

- 8. The Court will entertain argument, but not testimony, on the return date of the order to show cause, unless the court and parties are advised to the contrary no later than **THREE** (3) DAYS before the return date.
- 9. Pursuant to \underline{R} . 4:52-1, defendant may move for dissolution of the temporary restraining order on a minimum of **TWO (2) DAYS** notice to the plaintiff.
